

Institutional Commitment





For 160 years, the fairgrounds site and the intersection of Stewart and Main streets served as a community destination. There were also decades where this area was the economic and innovation engine for the city and region.

As anchor institutions, the partners are committed to a plan that authentically builds on their institutional missions and values, promotes economic development, and fosters a unique sense of place that serves broad community interests.

In late 2018 OnMain, a not-for-profit development organization was created to lead the day-to-day operations. The board of trustees meets monthly to lead and direct this important work.





In October of 2018, a new name was announced for the 38 acres at the northwest corner of Main and Stewart streets — onMain: Dayton's Imagination District — a place that fosters imagination, innovation and inclusivity.



Premier Health

Based in Dayton, Ohio, Premier Health (premierhealth.com) has a mission to improve the health of the communities it serves. The health system operates three hospitals: Miami Valley Hospital in Dayton with additional inpatient sites in Centerville and Englewood; Atrium Medical Center in Middletown; and Upper Valley Medical Center in Miami County. In addition, the health system offers a wide range of care choices, including virtual care; e-visits; a telestroke network and other telehealth options; an urgent care network; free-standing emergency departments; a large primary and specialty care network; and home health services.

Premier Health is the second largest employer in the region and the largest health care system in Southwest Ohio.

Create an urban neighborhood with 18-hour-a-day street activity by developing 2,500 new housing units between 2010 and 2020.

Transportation & Infrastructure

Continue to create a transportation network for the Greater Downtown that serves the needs of pedestrians, bicyclists, public transit users, and motorists, and stimulates development.

Arts & Entertainment

Develop a broad-based event and public space programming strategy that provides solutions to current challenges and identifies long-term funding sustainability.




Initial Phase — Think Dayton Building at Stewart and Main


The Think Dayton Building will be a place that...

Fosters the health and well-being of its tenants and surrounding community members.















Design Intent

The design of the Think Dayton Building will be:








Third Floor

A Catalytic Building

The Think Dayton Building will kick-off the development at onMain. This 125,000 square foot employment building includes uses focused on research, development and business acceleration as well as state of the art education and training. The Think Dayton building will be a place that cultivates creative design, facilitates cross disciplinary collaboration and translate ideas into implementation.

The building will feature a high-bay research space with wet lab capability, research space, classrooms, open offices, conference space, a coffee shop and two story atrium with access to Main Street, the Think Dayton Plaza and nearby parking.
